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A: INTRODUCTION TO THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FLOWER ARRANGEMENT SOCIETIES

A.1. Background details about NAFAS, its history and nature

NAFAS was inaugurated in 1959 to bring together floral groups that had formed across the country. It comprises of 21 geographical areas across the British Isles. It is non-profit making and has charitable status. In the organisation's constitution it states: "The Aims of the Association shall be: To advance public education in the art of floral design and related subjects and to further any other charitable purpose or purposes."

NAFAS has developed a national standard in the training of its demonstrators, judges, tutors, and speakers.

The Education Committee oversees all courses in Floral Art and Design run by the organisation. This committee also has responsibility in the production of educational publications pertaining to all aspects of floral art e.g., *Guide to Period Flower Arranging*.

A.2. Track record in developing education or training programmes and links with OCN

Once NAFAS was formed the organisation developed committees to help further its aims. The Education Committee, members of which are required to hold a teaching qualification, offer biennial courses for teachers. The NAFAS Diploma in Floral Art and Design was offered nationwide through the Open College Networks. NAFAS has worked closely with other OCNs assisting in locating moderators and approving teachers for colleges. NAFAS has also provided tutor training days and additional staff development for moderators of floral design.

A.3. Reasons for developing the Course Programmes

In 2021 NAFAS decided to bring their courses in-house and apply to become an awarding body. A series of shorter modular courses were designed based on previous NAFAS courses. Application is being made through OFQAL (England) SQA (Scotland) CCEA (Northern Ireland) and QW (Wales) to recognise NAFAS as an awarding body. Once this is complete, a three-level certificated course will be released based on modules.

E.1. Tutor support

E.2. Target learners

- Those who enjoy flower arranging but have no formal qualification
- Those who want to learn about using plant material in a creative manner, for example gardeners
- Those for whom floral design may be a means to return to education, training, or employment
- Members of NAFAS flower clubs
- Group leaders in the charity sector
- Leaders of disadvantaged groups
- Those wishing to pursue an interest within the NAFAS disciplines, e.g., Judges, Demonstrators, Speakers, Tutors.

E.3. Entry to programme for Learners

This is at the tutors' discretion.

- Skill level: learners admitted with no prior knowledge or experience.
- Skill level: learners should ideally have some prior knowledge of working with plant material in a creative manner.
- Skill level: learners should have equivalent qualification, experience, or recorded prior knowledge to the Tutors' satisfaction. It is recommended that an interview be used during the selection process.

Note: We do not encourage courses of mixed skill levels in learners, particularly with including beginners in a course at a higher level then Foundation, as this can change the class dynamic. The Tutor should carefully check the previous experience of the Learner before they accept them onto the course.

We also do not encourage Learners be included in these courses, who do not wish to complete the involved written work, as this also changes the class dynamic.

For learners wishing to avoid written work, Tutors are advised that it would be best to refer them to Leisure classes.

E.4. Programme delivery for learners

The pattern of study could be part time and be a nominal 10 hours per credit to include both contact and private study hours.

F. PROGRESSION OPPORTUNITIES FOR LEARNERS

Learners may progress through the courses according to the skill levels indicated and as advised by their tutor. In time they may apply to complete a certificated course.

F.1. Further learning or training that may be available to learners

NAFAS offers learning opportunities in several disciplines.

Design courses e.g., Foundation in Art and Design

Opportunities may exist to further education in other allied industries.

F.2. Employment or career prospects that may be available

to learners

Learners can progress to:

- Employment and training in the floristry, events, or retail display industry
- Teacher training
- NAFAS Area and National qualifications for Demonstrators, Judges, Tutors, and Speakers through the learners' own Area Associations

F.3. Learner Support

NAFAS is available to provide learner support throughout the programme. Tutors should identify support required and where it may be obtained.

F.4. Copyright Agreement

The Tutor should provide Learners with confirmation that the course content is bound by copyright laws within the UK and the distribution of the course content outside of the course is strictly prohibited.

G. ADVICE & GUIDANCE

Pre-entry	Learners will receive guidance from the organisation or independent tutor on the requirements of the course and progression from it.
On Programme	Learners will receive guidance from the organisation or independent tutor on their progression and assessment of work.
On Exit	Learners will receive guidance from the organisation or independent tutor on their progression and assessment of work.

H. NAFAS QUALITY ASSURANCE PROCEDURE AND GUIDELINES

There is a two-tier system of quality assessment:

- 1. Area Quality Assurers who work directly with the tutors to support them and undertake assessments by appointment to ensure they are abiding by the guidelines.
- 2. National Quality Assurers who request samples of learners work to evaluate and review for certification and standardisation.
